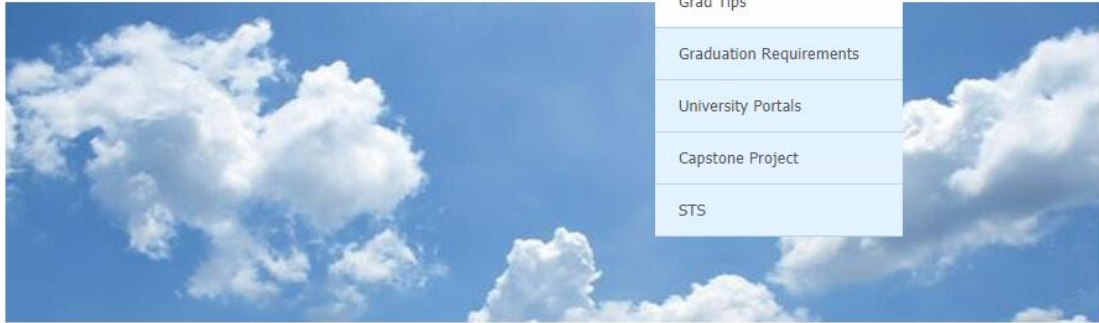

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
Tips for Grade 12s:

- Review graduation requirements. Your capstone course is a grad requirement. Please take course seriously.
- Be aware of post-secondary institutions application deadlines - different programs in different institutions may vary
- If you are using an online course to meet university admission requirement, that online course needs to be completed by January 31st of your grade 12 year
- Throughout grade 12, you will need to create many usernames/passwords for STS, university portals, scholarships, and university applications, consider using the same username/password for all, or if not, record this information in a safe place
- Do not wait until the last minute to hand in your application just right before the deadline. Doing this will cause unnecessary stress. Apply earlier so you may have time to review and prepare all the necessary documents
- It's ok to apply earlier when your documents are not yet ready (e.g. term marks). Those can come later in the application process
- READ thoroughly any emails that universities/PSI sends back to you. There are often useful instructions and deadline information, such as deadline for supplemental information submission, grades submission, housing application, accepting offer, paying deposit, etc
- Remember that many community colleges open application on October 1st - first come first serve
- Limit the number of PSI you are applying. Each one can be quite time consuming.

University Requirements

- Generally 6 Grade 12 courses for UBC + other Ontario Universities (SFU only requires 5; UVIC only requires 4)
- Language 11 is required for UBC but Introductory Language 11 is acceptable for SFU
- If your child has been in Canada for less than four years, ensure that he/she has met the English requirements for preferred PSI (Post-secondary Institution)
- Online courses should be completed by Jan 31st for the % to be counted towards admissions average for UBC, May for UVIC, and June for SFU



Admission Requirements

**Admission requirements change each year. It is students' responsibility to be informed by visiting desired PSI's website

Quarter System

- In absence of Grade 12 course grade, universities will refer to the Grade 11 course grade
- Grade 12 course marks take precedence over Grade 11 course marks

Quarter System

- "Having a quarter system will not negatively impact applicants' opportunities for admission or scholarship. They will still have to self-report all courses which they have taken or are planning to take in order to have their application evaluated. " - message directly from SFU admissions

Quarter System

- "We recognize that students' schedules and academics may be disrupted due to COVID-19 and where necessary we will make adjustments to our admissions timelines/practices as to not disadvantage students for something that is out of their control. Please also rest assured that we have had (and will continue to have) semester-based academic year applicants, so while our Admissions team will of course ensure they have an appropriate contextual understanding of what this means for VSB schools and applicants, semester-based systems/applications are also frequently seen by our admissions team."

Summary of General PSI deadlines

- BC Community colleges: Start October 1st
- US universities:
 - Early admission deadline: November 1
 - Regular admission deadline: January 1
- Ontario universities:
 - Application opens: October 1st
 - Early admission deadline: ranges from early November to Dec 1st (some Ontario schools do not have early admissions)
 - Student Awards deadline: December 1
 - Regular admission: Mid-January – early February
- BC universities:
 - Application opens: October 1st
 - Early admission deadline: ranges from early November to December 1st
 - Regular admission: mid-January to early February

We are currently accepting applications for the following semesters*:

- Fall 2020 (September to December)
- Spring 2021 (January to April)
- Summer 2021 (May to August)

* Not all programs accept applications for every semester. Note the "Start Date" field on each program page.

Deadlines

In order to avoid disappointment, please take a minute to become familiar with our application deadlines outlined below.

The deadline to submit a complete application in order to be admitted for the fall, spring, or summer semesters is the first day of classes for that semester. A complete application includes a completed application form, application fee payment, and any supporting documents required. No applications will be accepted after the deadline date. Applications for specific programs may be closed earlier than the first day of classes of the term. Please refer to the program's admissions requirements for more information.

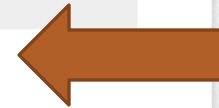

Watch out for application deadline vs. documents submission deadline



Tip

- Ontario schools recommend students to submit application late November/Early December for regular admissions, so all the supporting documents can arrive before the holidays
- BC schools - start application late November/early December- Do not wait until last minute

Why early admissions?

- Typically for students with strong grade 11 marks
- So that you can be eligible for entrance scholarships

Why regular admissions

- Time! (especially with UBC application)
(and other special programs, such as Business)

 - Student + Counsellor will need to upload transcript onto portal
 - Student will generally require a recommendation letter from a school staff

Applying to Ontario

- After application, instructions will be given to student on how to upload transcript
- Student will be asked to self-report, upload own transcript, or submit marks to student portal
- The STS information arrives too late for these out-of province schools in their decision making

- Applying to BC

- BCIT, UBC, and UVIC are not available through Education Planner. You need to apply to these institutions directly from their websites
- Set up Student Transcript Services (STS) to allow PSI to access their grades



There are different portals when applying to universities in different provinces/countries. The benefit of a portal is that you can create one account and apply to multiple institutions at the same time. Please refer to below:

- Check your numeracy and literacy results
- Show all courses you have completed and passed (including grades from summer school & online courses) to help you track your graduation status
- Does not show courses that are still in progress
- View and order secondary school transcripts
- Order your graduation diploma
- Send transcripts to post-secondary institutions (PSI)
- Allows PSI to access your student academic records

Instructions:

To get started, students will pick the type of student they are (for example, current student, former student or returning user). They will then select 'Order' which is found on the top right corner or left tab and then select 'Register' to create a Basic BCeID account to access their transcript information.


